OBSERVATIONS FROM THE DECK...BY PR. TOM GREVLOS (INTERIM SENIOR PASTOR)

I have always enjoyed the music of James Taylor (JT to his fans). I have seen him in concert a couple of times and appreciate the story-telling with his shy, reserved personality. While I have many favorite songs, I am especially fond of "Shower the People" with the lyrics, "Shower the people you love with love, show them the way that you feel...".

Love is the ethic of the Christian life. What does it mean to follow Jesus? "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength and love your neighbor as yourself." Jesus calls this the sum of the law, the central ethic of living as a child of God. Shower the people you love with love, yes, but Jesus goes even further in saying, shower the people you don't love with love. Jesus moves us from the Golden Rule to the Platinum Rule. This is what makes the Love as Jesus demonstrates so transformative. In the words of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. "Whom you want to change you must first love." In the words of Jesus, "Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you."

How do Dr. King's words and Jesus' words on the life-changing power of love make a difference in a world hell-bent on greed, blame, and demonizing others? How do we "shower the people we love with love" and shower with love those who are hard to love, including ourselves?

Humility and Service to others will shower life-changing love in the world. Albert Schweitzer once said, "I don't know what your destiny will be, but this I know: the only ones among you who will be truly happy are those who will have sought and found how to serve." Love is as love does. Our acts of serving others with a servant heart is the secret to the abundant grace and love God has already given to us.

Hope has been called to be a witness to the love of Jesus. This is more than an empty platitude but a call to go above and beyond what seems reasonable. When our heart breaks with what breaks the heart of God, we are humble in spirit. We recognize that we are blessed to be a blessing and walk alongside those who have been marginalized and forgotten. In being a servant church with a servant heart, the love of Jesus is reflected through us!

In the early church during the first century A.D., "The Way" as the church was called, was known for their expansive love for one another and others. It is how the church grew exponentially. Is this not our reason for being, our identity in Christ, to be a grace place where love is showered upon people? Is this not the best kind of evangelism? The present and future of Hope Lutheran Church is shining bright because at the heart of this community is the love of Jesus. It is that simple and it is that life changing. May this ethic of Love always be who Hope is!


PRAYER SHAWL MINISTRY



Our congregation has given over \$28,000 for LA Fire Response, so far.







HOPE BOOK CLUB THE FROZEN RIVER BY ARIEL LAWHON

Maine, 1789: When the Kennebec River freezes, entombing a man in the ice, Martha Ballard is summoned to examine the body and determine cause of death. As a midwife and healer, she is privy to much of what goes on behind closed doors in Hallowell. Her diary is a record of every birth and death, crime and debacle that unfolds in the close-knit community.

Months earlier, Martha documented the details of an alleged rape committed by two of the town's most respected gentlemen—one of whom has now been found dead in the ice. But when a local physician undermines her conclusion, declaring the death to be an accident, Martha is forced to investigate the shocking murder on her own.

Over the course of one winter, as the trial nears, and whispers and prejudices mount, Martha doggedly pursues the truth. Her diary soon lands at the center of the scandal, implicating those she loves, and compelling Martha to decide where her own loyalties lie.

Clever, layered, and subversive, Ariel Lawhon's newest offering introduces an unsung heroine who refused to accept anything less than justice at a time when women were considered best seen and not heard. The Frozen River is a thrilling, tense, and tender story about a remarkable woman who left an unparalleled legacy yet remains nearly forgotten to this day.





STEPHEN MINISTERY

The Story of Stephen Ministry is based on a story in the Book of Acts about a group of apostles who were appointed to look after or care for the needs of the poor and needy.

There are many ways we can fulfill this appointment. One is to train to become a Stephen Minister. This is a ministry of loving, caring and listening to another person who is going through a particularly tough time. The difficulties that might lead someone to want a Stephen Minister are varied. It can be grief. It can be a health crisis. It can be any situation that could lead a person to extreme sadness or despair. It could be that your child, even adult children, are in trouble and you don't know how to help.

Stephen Ministers are called to provide a time each week with a care receiver for listening, praying, providing encouragement and support.

People are often reluctant to ask for a Stephen Minister because they underestimate the toll their situation is taking on themselves and their families.

Stephen Ministers are people who have a natural God-given gift of caring for others to help them solve their situations with grace and love.


